B. Free Franklin Post Office

Visit the only colonial-themed post office still operated by the United States Postal Service.



Betsy Ross House

Known as the “Birthplace of Old Glory”, the home pays tribute to the Betsy Ross and the first American flag.



Carpenter's Historic Hall

It was here that the First Continental Congress decided to bar the import of slaves to the colonies.



Christ Church

Founded in 1695, members included signers of the Declaration of Independence and American Revolutionary War leaders.



Christ Church Burial Ground

An early-American cemetery, it's the final resting place of Benjamin Franklin and his family.



Independence Hall

The alley's Georgian and Federal-style houses and cobblestone road will take you back to the 1770's.



Independence Hall

One of the most important buildings in American history, both the Declaration of Independence and the US Constitution were signed here.



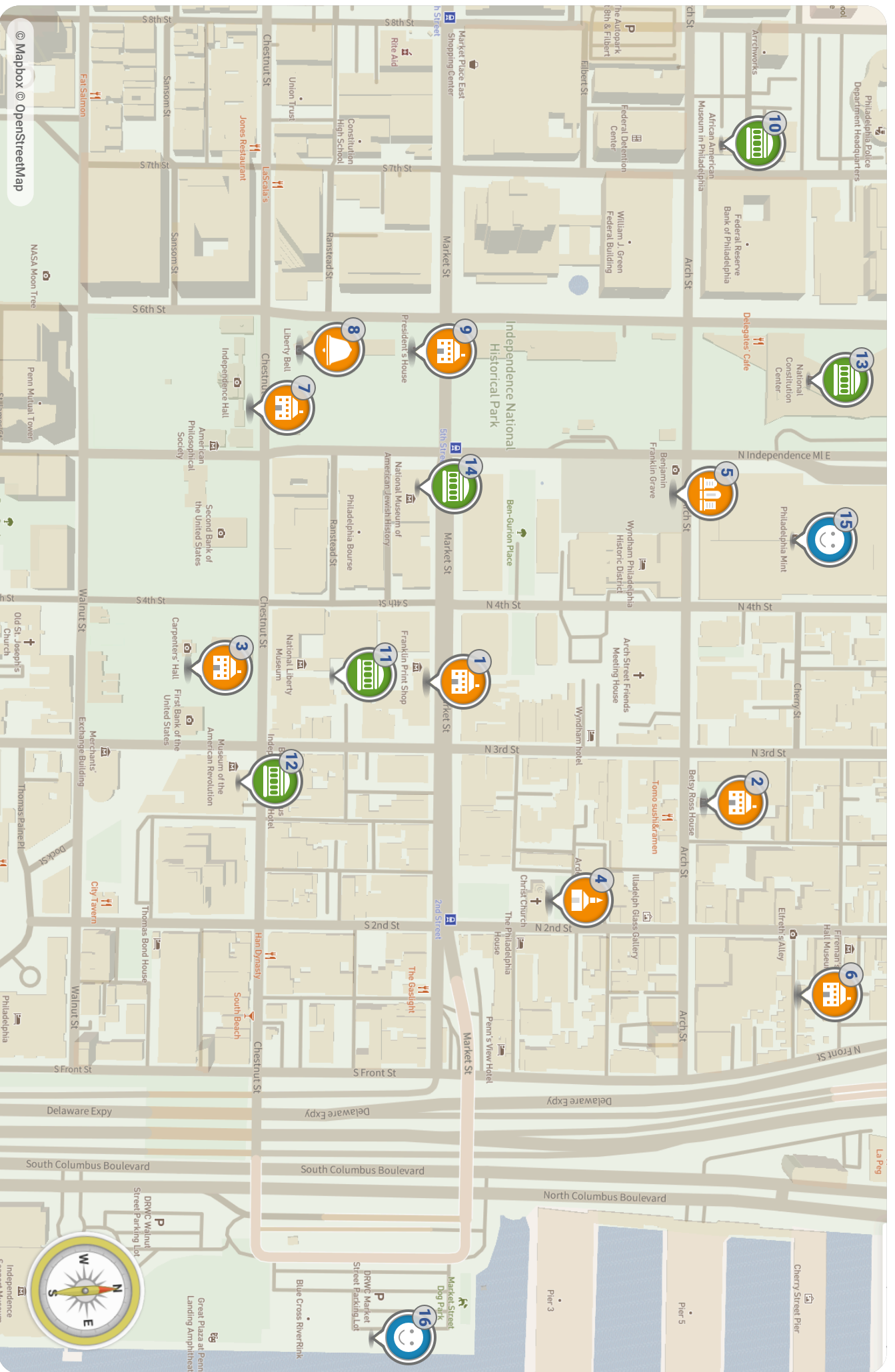
Liberty Bell
